Dear Glen Cove Downtown B.I.D. members,

The past year was one that can only be described as an extremely challenging year. We have been through a pandemic, lost loved ones, and endured months of lockdown. Our downtown businesses had to deal with New York State-mandated closures, and lockdowns of everything that the state did not deem as essential. Businesses were then allowed to reopen at reduced capacities and restaurants were limited to only offering takeout and outdoor dining. As the summer began, Patricia Holman, executive director of the Glen Cove Downtown Business Improvement District, initiated a conversation with Mayor Tenke, who was able to secure street closures in the evenings from Thursday through Sunday to get downtown restaurants expanded outdoor dining space.

Patricia Holman and the Downtown Sounds Committee had to do some creative thinking and introduced a Virtual Downtown Sounds. The long-running free concert series on Friday evenings during July and August was able to continue, thanks to the efforts of the DTS Committee and the cooperation of the bands that participated. The concerts were produced relatively faultlessly, emceed by our own Patricia Holman and hosted by board member Fred Guarino of Tiki Recording Studios.

Unfortunately, the downtown lost some businesses during this time, but we also gained some new businesses like Simpliciti Café, and residents began moving in to the Village Square apartments.

Thank you to all the people who have served on the Board of Directors and the volunteers and sponsors who have made our events possible. Through the sacrifices made by our businesses and community, it appears that there is light at the end of the tunnel. I sincerely hope that we will be able to have Downtown Sounds take place in Village Square this summer and that our lives will start resembling a pre-pandemic normal soon

ing Covid restrictions in a difficult economy, yet downtown Glen Cove managed to regain a sense of normalcy. The downtown grew with both new businesses and new residents, and thanks to the

efforts of the Downtown Business Improvement District, it remained a hub of activity with a varie-

ty of festivities.

In 2021, the Glen Cove Downtown BID was able to resume all special events in person, and even

added a new event to its lineup – a New Year's Eve concert in Village Square. The ability to bring

missed these events as much as I did. The streets were packed every Friday night in July and Au-

gust for the Downtown Sounds Concert Series, which attracted the largest crowds in the 25-year

history of the concerts. Not only was this encouraging for the Downtown Sounds performers, it

also meant good news for downtown restaurants, many of which expanded their outdoor seating

areas to accommodate more diners.

The streets also got a facelift of sorts with the addition of string lighting on Glen and Bridge

Streets, making the downtown more inviting to residents. The Village Square apartments and the addition of seven new businesses has brought new life to downtown Glen Cove. I look forward to

the continued growth expected in 2022.

What is the Business Improvement District?

A Business Improvement District is a formal organization made up of property owners and commercial tenants who are dedicated to promoting business development and improving an area's quality of life. B.I.D.s deliver supplemental services such as public events, marketing and promotional programs, capital improvements, and beautification for the area – all funded by a special assessment paid by property owners within the district.

The B.I.D. provides services beyond those of the local municipality. The main priority of those services is self-determined by the B.I.D. Board of Directors and the B.I.D. membership. The B.I.D. Board prioritizes needs and works with the Executive Director in developing programs. The Executive Director and staff carry out programs and provide guidance. Goals are accomplished by leveraging assets. The B.I.D. works in partnership with the mayor, city agencies and other community organizations.

The B.I.D. serves as a liaison between its shareholders and City Hall, as an advocate, and an information clearing house. While maintaining information on the downtown, the B.I.D. also maintains information, resources and referrals helpful to its membership.

Furthermore, the B.I.D. helps revitalize neighborhoods and catalyze economic developments by implementing an inviting, dynamic and sustainable community.

Capital Improvements

In accordance with the Downtown Business Improvement District plan, the Capital Improvements Committee implements many visual improvements to the downtown area. During the coronavirus pandemic, the Glen Cove Downtown B.I.D. felt more than ever it was the time to spend our resources on Capital Improvements to ensure that our downtown remained welcoming and charming in an effort to boost morale and keep our community's spirits lifted. These projects, listed below, include new, ongoing and seasonal capital improvements.

- We purchased string lighting with a grant from PSEG, and with the help of Vinny Martinez and Mario Caldrone of DPW, we continued our efforts on Bridge and Glen streets to light up downtown.
- At the suggestion of the B.I.D. and led by former Deputy Mayor Basdavanos, RXR Realty remodeled what is commonly know as the Police Booth.
- During the pandemic the B.I.D. doubled its budget on fall flowers and had over 1,000 mums and cabbages planted by Testa Landscaping.
- We had such a great response to decorating the lamp posts in the downtown with "he" and "she" scarecrows that we added more this year to ensure that each and every lamp post was decorated.
- We purchased over 65 flower baskets of vinca flowers.
- We added additional flower arms to our lamp posts.
- We replaced banner poles and brackets.
- The B.I.D. supplies Downtown Sounds banners that are hung during summer and fall.
- The B.I.D. provides access to seasonal autumn flowers and decorations at wholesale prices for our members.
- We provide American Flags and Nautical Flags that greet us as we enter downtown and are proudly raised by DPW.
- We partner with DPW in decorating the streets for the holidays with decorations that the B.I.D. provides.
- Through sponsorship from American Paving and Masonry, we converted the Police Booth into a Holiday Cottage.
- We make sure litter, leaves and weeds are removed from downtown walkways.
- We hold a contract with Testa Landscaping to maintain the majority of the landscapes in the downtown area that include horticultural and mulching maintenance.
- The Downtown Business Improvement District partners with the Glen Cove Community
 Development Agency to encourage businesses to participate in its Façade & Sign Programs.

Marketing & Economic Development

The Glen Cove Downtown Business Improvement District promotes and markets our businesses through social media reaching up to 10,0000 people in its demographic groups.

Since the pandemic the Glen Cove Downtown B.I.D. has given our restaurants and businesses an opportunity to highlight their businesses for a free commercial that appears on Channel 12 News and Fios 1. This year the B.I.D. produced and purchased 7 commercials that gave 24 commercial spots to businesses that participated. Each commercial aired an average of 124 times on both Channel 12 News and Fios 1.

The B.ID. also produces and purchases commercials to promote Downtown Sounds, inviting visitors to join in on the dancing in the streets.

We recognize that today people learn through visual experience, so in the last year we have used videos on social media to create a fun and inviting feeling to our downtown. These videos have been shared on our social media and many have been viewed close to 10K times.

For every event and program the B.I.D. produces or initiates, a press release is written and sent to the press, and the B.I.D. often makes headlines.

Economic Development

While other communities lost many businesses during the pandemic, downtown Glen Cove welcomed 8 new businesses in 2020 and 7 new businesses in 2021

Financial Overview

The Glen Cove District Management Association, Inc., d/b/a the Glen Cove Downtown Business Improvement District (B.I.D.) is a non-profit organization incorporated on Nov. 18, 1996, under the Not-For-Profit Corporation Law of New York State. The primary purpose of the association is to promote the preservation & development of the downtown commercial district of the City of Glen Cove and to make the area more attractive and accessible. Support for the Glen Cove Downtown Business Improvement District comes from a variety of public and private sources.

The association has entered into a baseline services agreement with the City of Glen Cove whereby the city levies a special real estate assessment on taxable commercial & residential properties within a geographic area, collects the funds & disperses them to the association. The assessment levied by the city is recorded by the association. The city remits funds to the association as per Article 19-A of NYS Municipal Law. The association uses the funds to

provide services not provided by the city.

The fiscal year for the Business Improvement District starts January 1st and ends on December 31st.

Many individuals volunteer their time and perform a variety of tasks that assist the association.

The association is exempt from income taxes under Section $501 \odot (3)$ of the Internal Revenue Code, therefore no provision for income taxes is reflected.

At this time, the association holds no funds for others.

At this time, the association has no notes payable. The association has monthly office rental, phone service and ISP obligations. The association maintains insurance as per standard practice: Directors & Officers Liability, General Liability, Workers Compensation, Unemployment Insurance & event insurance. It has no other financial commitments.

The preparations of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates & assumptions that affect certain reported amounts & disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.


The City of Glen Cove and Glen Cove Community Development Agency Pedestrian Improvement Project

The City of Glen Cove and Glen Cove Community Development Agency completed a pedestrian improvement project in the Downtown Business Improvement District (BID). The project included planning, design, and construction of pedestrian improvements in downtown Glen Cove, specifically the replacement of 28 curb ramps and upgrades to 16 crosswalks on Bridge, Glen, and School Streets. The project also included the addition of a new crosswalk and curb ramps on School Street in a location where there was not previously a crosswalk and curb ramps.

The project has enhanced the visibility and durability of crosswalks, brought curb ramps into compliance with Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) standards, fixed ramps that had been in a state of disrepair, and improved pedestrian safety in downtown Glen Cove.

The Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) awarded funding for the project to the City of Glen Cove, with funding administered by the New York State Department of Transportation (NYSDOT). CDBG funding was also used toward project costs.

Construction of the project occurred in spring and summer 2021.



The Glen Cove Downtown B.I.D. congratulates Glen Floors on celebrating 90 years in business. The business started in 1932 at a small storefront at 68 Glen St., Glen Cove by Fred Capobianco. Originally he worked with his father at Antonio's own appliance & furniture store in the Orchard installing floor covering before opening his own store.

Glen Floors has always been a family owned and operated enterprise. The reins have passed from Antonio's small business to his son Fred and now to some of his 17 children. Carol (Capobianco) Nelson, Jerome Capobianco, William Capobianco and Fred's son-in-law Michael Capobianco and Jane (Capobianco) Rodier. Under their guidance the business continues to grow. Their sales staff, store manager Lou-Ann Thompson and installers are considered part of the Capobianco family.



The first store opened in 1932 at 68 Glen Street as Glen Cove Floor Covering Co.

Now located at 30 Glen Street, Glen Floors has been a staple of the Glen Cove community for 90 years.
